This week's mastery quiz has four topics. You should do topics 3 and 4, and optionally one of the previous two topics. Don't worry if you make a minor error, but try to demonstrate your mastery of the underlying material. You shouldn't spend more than 20-30 minutes on this quiz.

Feel free to consult your notes, but please don't talk about the actual quiz questions with other students in the course.

Remember that you are trying to demonstrate that you understand the concepts involved. For all these problems, justify your answers and explain how you reached them. Do not just write "yes" or "no" or give a single number.

4. Integrals Involving Exponentials and Logarithms

Compute the following integrals:

(a) $\int 3^x(4 + 3^x)^3 dx =$

Solution: Set $u = 4 + 3^x$ so that $du = 3^x \ln(3) dx$. Then

$$\begin{aligned}\int 3^x(4 + 3^x)^3 dx &= \int \frac{1}{\ln(3)} u^3 du \\ &= \frac{u^4}{4 \ln(3)} + C = \frac{(4 + 3^x)^4}{4 \ln(3)}\end{aligned}$$

(b) $\int \frac{e^y}{e^y - 2} dy =$

Solution:

Set $u = e^y - 2$ so $du = e^y dy$, and we have

$$\int \frac{e^y}{e^y - 2} dy = \int \frac{du}{u} = \ln |u| + C = \ln(e^y - 2) + C.$$

(c) $\int \frac{\cos(\ln(t))}{t} dt =$

Solution:

If we take $u = \ln(t)$ then $du = \frac{dt}{t}$ and we get

$$\int \frac{\cos(\ln(t))}{t} dt = \int \cos(u) du = \sin(u) + C = \sin(\ln(t)) + C.$$

3. Derivatives of Exponentials and Logarithms

(a) Compute $\frac{d}{dx} \cos(x)^{\sin(x)}$

Solution:

$$\begin{aligned}y &= \cos(x)^{\sin(x)} \\ \ln|y| &= \sin(x) \ln |\cos(x)| \\ y'/y &= \cos(x) \ln |\cos(x)| + \sin(x) \frac{-\sin(x)}{\cos(x)} \\ y' &= \cos(x)^{-\sin(x)} \left(\cos(x) \ln |\cos(x)| - \frac{\sin^2(x)}{\cos(x)} \right)\end{aligned}$$

(b) Find an equation for the tangent line to the curve $y = \ln(2x^2 - 3x - 1)$ at the point $(2, 0)$.

Solution:

We have $y' = \frac{1}{2x^2 - 3x - 1}(4x - 3)$ and thus $y'(2) = \frac{5}{1} = 5$. So the equation of the tangent line is

$$y - 0 = 5(x - 2).$$

(c) Compute $\frac{d}{dt}2^t \log_5(t)$.

Solution:

$$\frac{d}{dt}2^t \log_5(t) = 2^t \ln(2) \log_5(t) + 2^t \frac{1}{t \ln(5)}.$$

2. Topic 2: Exponents and Logarithms

(a) Showing your work, compute $\log_3(90) + \log_3(3/2) - \log_3(5)$.

Solution:

$$\log_4(24) - \log_4(15) + \log_4(20) = \log_3(24 \cdot 20/15) = \log_4(32) = 5/2.$$

(b) Give an exact solution for the equation $e^{5t-2} = 7$.

Solution:

$$\begin{aligned} e^{5t-2} &= 7 \\ 5t - 2 &= \ln(7) \\ 5t &= \ln(7) + 2 \\ t &= \frac{\ln(7) + 2}{5}. \end{aligned}$$

(c) Compute $e^{5 \ln(3) - 2 \ln(4)}$. (Give an exact answer with no decimals.)

Solution:

$$e^{5 \ln(3) - 2 \ln(4)} = (e^{\ln(3)})^5 / (e^{\ln(4)})^2 = \frac{3^5}{4^2} = \frac{243}{16}.$$

(d) Give an exact solution for the equation $\log_5(11x + 4) = 3$.

Solution:

$$\begin{aligned} \log_5(11x + 4) &= 3 \\ 11x + 4 &= 125 \\ 11x &= 121 \\ x &= 11. \end{aligned}$$

1. Topic 1: Inverse Functions

(a) Is $f(x) = x^3 - x$ invertible or not? Justify your answer.

Solution: We have $f(-1) = f(0) = f(1) = 0$ so this function is not one-to-one, and thus not invertible.

(b) Find a formula for the inverse of $g(x) = (x - 1)^3 + 3$.

Solution:

$$\begin{aligned}
 y &= (x-1)^3 + 3y - 3 && = (x-1)^3 \\
 \sqrt[3]{y-3} &= x-1 \\
 x &= 1 + \sqrt[3]{y-3}
 \end{aligned}$$

so $g^{-1}(y) = 1 + \sqrt[3]{y-3}$. (You can use whichever variable you like in your formula.)

(c) Let $h(x) = x^5 + x$. Compute $(h^{-1})'(2)$.

Solution: By the Inverse Function Theorem, we know that

$$(h^{-1})'(2) = \frac{1}{h'(h^{-1}(2))}.$$

Guess and check shows that $h(1) = 2$ so $h^{-1}(2) = 1$. And we know that

$$h'(x) = 5x^4 + 1$$

and thus

$$h'(1) = 5 + 1 = 6$$

Thus

$$(h^{-1})'(2) = \frac{1}{6}.$$
