## S6: Differential Equations

(a) Find a general solution to the equation $y^{\prime}=x^{2}+1+x^{2} y+y$.
(b) Find a (specific) solution to the initial value problem $y^{\prime} / x=\cos ^{2}(y)$ if $y(0)=\pi / 4$

## S7: Sequences and Series

(a) Let $b_{n}=\frac{n!}{2^{n}}$. Compute the first four terms of the sequence, and compute $\lim _{n \rightarrow \infty} b_{n}$, with justification.
(b) Compute $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \frac{2}{n^{2}+5 n+6}$. Justify your computation rigorously.
(c) Compute $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \frac{2^{n}}{3 \cdot 5^{n-1}}$.
