(a) Compute $\int \frac{\sin(2t) + \cos(2t)}{\sin(2t) - \cos(2t)} dt$.

(b) Compute $\frac{d}{dx} x^{\ln(x)}$.

(c) Compute $\int \frac{3^x}{\sqrt{1 - 3^{2x}}} dx$.

S1: Invertible Functions

- (a) Showing your work, compute $\log_3(90) + \log_3(3/2) - \log_3(5)$. Your answer should be an integer.
- (b) Compute $\tan(\arcsin(2/5))$.
- (c) Let $h(x) = x^5 + x$. Compute $(h^{-1})'(2)$.
- (d) Is $f(x) = \sqrt{x^4 + 1}$ invertible? If so, find a formula for the inverse. If not, explain why not. Justify your answer.
